The health and prosperity of our families, communities, and nation require an investment in the physical and emotional health of our young children.

Nationwide, communities, states, territories, and tribes are pioneering new ways to promote young child wellness through Project LAUNCH, a federal initiative funded by the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA). Project LAUNCH sites increase and improve evidence-based programs for children (0-8) and families and strengthen collaboration among child-serving organizations so that all children enter school ready to succeed.


IMPACT OF PROJECT LAUNCH

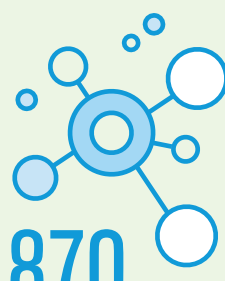

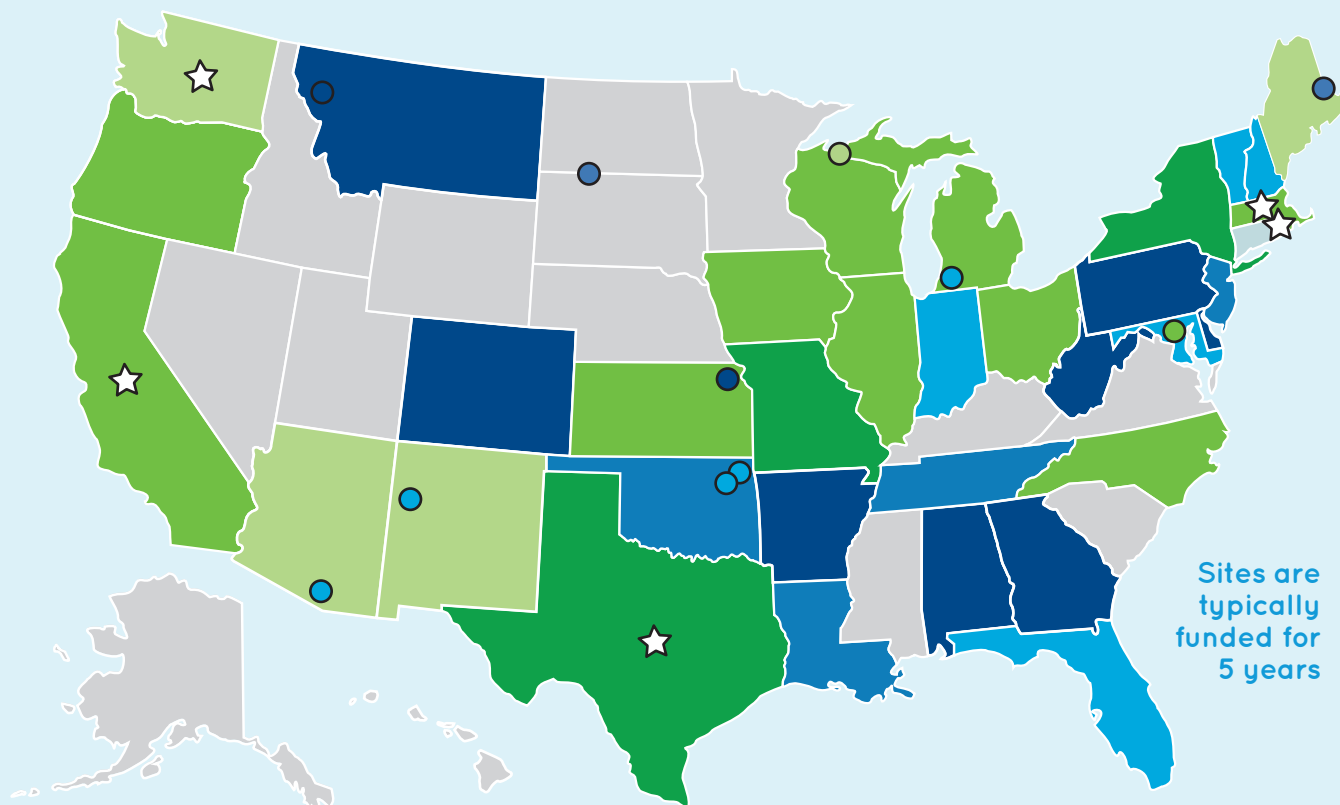
